



What happened to CHEM 141 & CHEM 142?

The Emory Department of Chemistry is rolling out a new undergraduate curriculum. The new classes incorporate all the same chemistry content while providing students with more opportunities to explore real-world connections and engage in active learning.

CHEM 141 & CHEM 142 were part of our old curriculum, but we know some students still need the information provided in this class. Here is an overview of how to substitute a new course for CHEM 141 and/or CHEM 142 in some of the most common cases.

I haven't taken any chemistry classes yet...

Great! (And, where have you been?) Start with CHEM 150 and CHEM 150L.

I've completed CHEM 141...

Next up, you should enroll in CHEM 202 and 202L.

I've completed CHEM 141 and CHEM 142...

Next up, you should enroll in CHEM 202 and 202L. CHEM 142 and CHEM 202 are substantially different and if you will need both courses.

I've completed CHEM 222 and 222L...

Next up, you should enroll in CHEM 204 and CHEM 204L.

I earned a 4 or 5 on the CHEM AP exam...

We recommend that you start chemistry at Emory by enrolling in CHEM 202z and CHEM 202zL. However, if you feel that your AP background is weak OR you completed AP two or more years ago, you should consider starting with CHEM 150 and CHEM 150L. If you want to begin chemistry coursework in the spring, you may enroll in CHEM 202 at that time with no additional prerequisites.
